Veracity will make Coexistence mode recommendations to optimize your Direct Routing services, we also recommend you review the <u>coexistence & journey</u> from SfB to Teams documentation to best understand how these settings will affect your organization and users. Your Tenant(s) and User(s) being set to <u>TEAMS ONLY mode</u> as soon as possible will simplify your implementation, maximize Teams features, and optimize the user experience.

To formally prepare your organization for its journey to Teams, you need to understand the upgrade scenarios that will let your organization fully embrace Microsoft Teams & Veracity Hosted Direct Routing as your sole communications and collaboration solution. To help familiarize your organization with the various modes, concepts, and terminology relevant to upgrading from Skype for Business to Teams see <u>Microsoft Teams and Skype for Business coexistence and interoperability</u>.
